We are in search of a wide variety of volunteers for several roles

Volunteer Committee Lead:

We are in need of a volunteer committee lead who will become a member of the Board of Operations. The person in this role will lead the strategic sourcing and retention of volunteers, partner with the marketing committee to plan and host events that celebrate our volunteers and express the needs of DFS NWA. This person would also plan and host monthly suit sorting Saturdays, and will meet monthly with the executive director and vice president of the Board of Operations. This role requires a commitment of five to 10 hours per month.

Volunteer Committee Member:

We are in need of three to five volunteers to assist the volunteer committee lead. Volunteers will help source other volunteers to fill the needs of DFS NWA, and provide daytime boutique support. Committee members will also assist in the planning of volunteer events, as well as become an advocate for our organization. This role requires a commitment of five hours per month.

Secretary for Board of Operations:

We are in need of a secretary to the Board of Operations. The person in this role will work closely with the new executive director, Ajia Mignon, to prepare for monthly meetings and take meeting minutes. The person in this role will also take on additional administrative tasks as needed, which includes data entry, process documentation and mail outs. This role requires a commitment of five to 10 hours a month.

Mentors:

We are in need of people who can lead our mentoring program, as well as create and lead workshops for the career center. Mentors would create and cover a wide variety of topics that include personal branding and the use of a LinkedIn profile, public speaking, and time management. The anticipated time commitment for this role is 10 hours for material development and two to five hours to lead a workshop.
